Climb aboard a motorcoach and explore some of the historic and culturally-significant places of Southeastern PA with Landis Valley's knowledgeable staff. Motorcoach boards at 8:45 a.m. Breakfast and lunch included (not eligible for the no-meal option). Trips include walking so proper footwear is essential.

Fonthill and the Mercer Museum

June 20, 2017

Cost: \$135.00 (\$128.25 for LVA members)

Head east to explore the collections of Henry Mercer, a contemporary of Henry Landis. You'll start the day exploring the 44 rooms of Fonthill Castle, Mercer's poured reinforced concrete estate house, which was built between 1908-1912. After that, you will receive a rare behind-the-scenes tour of the Bucks County Historical Society's Storage and Collection Center, which is closed to regular visitors. Following lunch (provided) at the Mercer Museum, the day will conclude with a self-guided tour of the Mercer Museum's 55 exhibit rooms and alcoves filled with tools and products of almost every American craft, trade and occupation.

Berks County: Early Industrial History & Heritage

Cost: \$135.00 (\$128.25 for LVA members)

In this trip to Berks County, you'll visit the Gruber Wagon Works (an intact wagon manufacturing complex built in 1882), tour the C. Howard Hiester Canal Center, the

adjacent Union Canal lock and the Wertz's Red Bridge (the longest covered bridge in Berks County), and then head to Reading to the Historical Society of Berks County to tour the newly renovated exhibit galleries. Lunch (provided) will be at the Berks Heritage Center.

A Day in Historic New Castle

William Penn landed in New Castle on his first trip to his colonies in 1681. Visit the Old Courthouse (Delaware's first capitol, built in 1732), the unique Dutch House (Holland Dutch in architecture and furnishings), the George Reed II House (a great Federal mansion with a 1920's speakeasy in the basement!) and historic churches. Lunch (provided) is in the historic armory.

Germantown II

Germantown, founded in 1683, is rich in historic treasures. First, we visit Historic Rittenhouse Town, site of the first paper mill in America and the ancestral home of astronomer/clock maker David Rittenhouse. We will tour a range of historic structures on this unique site. After that, a visit to Cliveden, the great Georgian home of the Chew family until the 1970's. The Battle of Germantown was literally centered on its lawn. Lunch (provided) will be on Cliveden's grounds.

The Drop Spindle and the Spinning Wheel

Cost: \$205.00 (\$194.75 for LVA members)

We'll go back to the basics of spinning to learn how the various tools used in this art form function and how you can improve your technique. You'll identify the parts of the given tools to better understand the purpose of each, as well as discuss the fiber aspect of wool. Then, you'll proceed with the timing of draw and twist coordination to create a beautiful product. Optional drop spindle kit can be purchased from instructor at \$35 per kit.

The Practical Chocolatier

The most delicious chemistry class you'll ever take. Making chocolate candies is a controlled balance in chemistry, attainable by anyone with patience. Dr. Susan Richman will teach you how to make creamy and crunchy centers such as salt caramels, toffees, brittles, opera creams, marshmallow, barks and peanut butter cups. And, most importantly, you'll temper chocolate and enrobe centers. Take home chocolates that survive the tastings.

Finding Your Way Around the Hearth

Beginning Hand-Weave Caning

Chair caning is the process of weaving strands of the inner bark of the rattan vine through holes around the inside perimeter of a chair seat to create a sturdy, comfortable, and beautiful seat. In this class, you will learn how to weave a hand-cane (6-step) pattern from Bill Brick, charter member of the Seatweaver's Guild and owner/proprietor of B-Reseated Chair Weaving in Hanover, PA.

PA German Handwoven Tape Workshop

Cost: \$215.00 (\$204.75 for LVA members)

In this workshop, students enjoy a historical overview of handwoven tape, an extensive exploration of the traditional tape looms and the process of tape weaving. They learn to read a 'draft' and to 'dress' a loom. Students have fun weaving traditional patterns, along with some contemporary tape ideas. All materials will be supplied, including the use of a variety of tape looms. No experience necessary.

Paper Marbling and Traditional Bookbinding

In this class, you'll learn to transfer a painted design onto a large piece of paper; then you will use that piece as a cover for a book that you will bind yourself. Journal in the book for years to come and you will have created a piece that's all you! All supplies are included.

Summer Favorites Cooking Class

Funnel cake to pepper cabbage, there is nothing that brings up memories of summer picnics and fairs as much as the food. In this class, we will use the hearth and bake oven to make a selection of dishes that will speak to those memories.

Domestic Medicine for the Summer Months

In this class, you will have a choice of building a 19th century whirligig, a wooden weathervane, or various colonial toys depending on how many days you sign up for. No woodworking experience needed—just a desire to make something fun!

Pottery Making: Wheel, Hand-building, and Decorating

Cost: \$230.00 (\$219.75 for LVA members) - 2-day

\$375.00 (\$357.50 for LVA members) - 4-day

This fun and supportive workshop caters to all levels of experience in clay. We will focus on making plates and platters through wheel throwing and slab construction using decorative techniques to create unique, personal, and functional tableware. A glaze applied to your piece will make it food safe. Allow 2 weeks for your work to dry and go through the firing process before you may take it home. Returning students and/or those staying for all four days will learn how to throw larger on the wheel, as well as use slab construction for building other functional forms.

Intermediate and Advanced Blacksmithing

This blacksmithing class is for intermediate and advanced students only. Students will work on moving and shaping materials, forging, and possibly more advanced welding skills, depending on existing skill level. Project is a cooking fork. Class is for ages 18 and up.

Horses Used as Draft Animals

Gain a different perspective of driving and horsemanship in this interactive class. From the first day, you'll learn the history of draft horses, the types of harness and how to put it on, and then you'll set off on a wagon, driving various hitches of horses around the village of Landis Valley. Fieldwork will be covered as well, if time and weather permit.


Important Information


